

## Statement on the Humanitarian Crisis in Gaza

The European Federation of Salaried Doctors (FEMS) expresses deep concern over the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Gaza, marked by extreme levels of malnutrition, the collapse of the healthcare system, and widespread suffering among the civilian population.

FEMS strongly emphasizes the need to uphold the fundamental principles of international humanitarian law and medical neutrality. Healthcare workers must be able to carry out their duties safely, and patients — particularly the most vulnerable — must have unimpeded access to essential care.

We stand in solidarity with all victims of the conflict, with our colleagues who continue to provide care under extremely difficult conditions, and with the people of Gaza, who are enduring a preventable and ethically unacceptable humanitarian disaster.

Considering the serious violations documented by numerous independent organizations, we call for:

- the immediate lifting of all restrictions on the entry and distribution of humanitarian aid, through safe and internationally recognized channels;
- full respect for international humanitarian law, including an end to attacks on civilians, medical facilities, ambulances, and healthcare personnel;
- the engagement of European institutions and national governments to promote all diplomatic efforts toward a permanent ceasefire.

As an organization representing salaried doctors across Europe, FEMS reaffirms its commitment to defending the right to health and to upholding the core values of the medical profession: humanity, integrity, and justice.

We believe that, in the face of a crisis of this magnitude, silence is not an option. The European medical community has a duty to speak out in defence of life, human dignity, and the international conventions that protect health in times of war.
